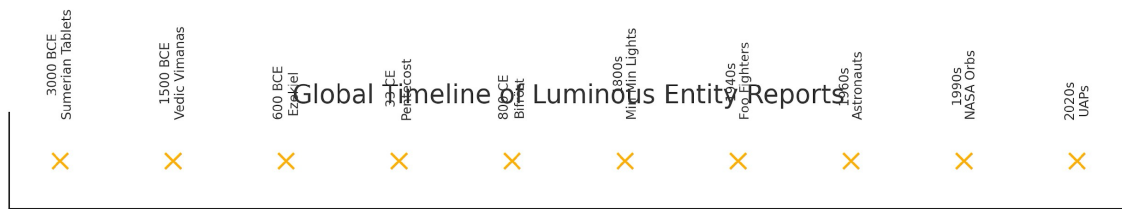

- **\*\*Hadith (Sahih Muslim)\*\*** – Angels such as Jibril are described as beings of light whose presence overwhelms human faculties.

These texts, drawn from seven major religious traditions, collectively portray luminous entities that appear, move, speak, or guide humanity through radiative presence. From structured light vessels and fiery beings to radiant pathways and glowing guides, these narratives are strikingly consistent with modern scientific observations of self-organising plasma and UAP behaviour.

## Religious Interpretation Throughout History

### Islam – Qur'an 24:35 (Ayat an-Nur)

Surah An-Nur (The Light), verse 35, is one of the most mystical and allegorically rich passages in the Qur'an:

"Allah is the Light of the heavens and the earth. The example of His light is like a niche within which is a lamp: the lamp is within glass, the glass as if it were a brilliant star, lit from [the oil of] a blessed olive tree, neither of the east nor of the west, whose oil would almost glow even if untouched by fire. Light upon light. Allah guides to His light whom He wills..." (Qur'an 24:35)

This verse presents a layered symbolic structure that Islamic scholars interpret as a metaphysical geometry of divine presence, which in form and function resembles nested toroidal fields found in plasma containment and electromagnetic harmonics, and self-sustaining field geometries found in plasma physics. Surah Al-Isra (17:1) describes the Prophet's celestial journey on Buraq, a luminous creature of impossible speed, echoing radiant aerial phenomena. Hadiths also describe angels made entirely of light, with Gabriel sometimes appearing with hundreds of wings of shining energy.

## **Hinduism – Vimanas and Jyotirlinga in the Mahabharata and Shiva Purana**

The Mahabharata (Vana Parva, Section 43) describes Vimanas—flying, radiant chariots capable of immense speed and emitting great light and sound. These divine vehicles operated with apparent anti-gravity and plasma-like propulsion, described as shining brighter than the sun, likely metaphorical renderings of advanced, radiant energy propulsion.

Similarly, the Shiva Purana describes the Jyotirlinga as a cosmic pillar of light, without base or end, blazing with solar intensity—a luminous manifestation of the god Shiva. This mirrors vertically stabilised plasma columns seen in nature and laboratory physics.

## **Biblical Accounts – Christian and Jewish Scriptures**

Biblical texts repeatedly mention divine or angelic entities associated with light, fire, and structured motion. Genesis 1:2 describes the Spirit of God hovering over the waters—an image that suggests motion, suspension, and radiant presence. Exodus 13:21 recounts a 'pillar of cloud by day and of fire by night' guiding the Israelites—matching the morphology of vertically-aligned plasma columns.

In Ezekiel 1:4–21, a stormy vision of 'wheels within wheels', glowing metal, and radiant beings parallels electromagnetic vortex structures, while Acts 2:3 describes 'tongues of fire' descending upon the apostles. The Book of Revelation includes beings with faces like the sun and eyes like flame—interpretable as emissive, radiant plasma structures.

## **Tibetan Buddhism – Bardo Thödol (Tibetan Book of the Dead)**

In the Bardo Thödol, the deceased encounter blinding lights that correspond to the Five Wisdoms. These lights are said to be intelligent and reactive, presenting divine truth. The lights' colours and intensities relate to one's spiritual state. Chapters 7–10 describe this encounter vividly, where the lights represent realms of consciousness—intense, luminous, and interactive—suggestive of structured plasma responding to mental or emotional fields, and paralleling the idea of interactive plasma intelligences.

## **Shinto – Amaterasu and the Light of Creation**

In the Kojiki, Amaterasu, the sun goddess in Shinto mythology, is born from the eye of the god Izanagi and retreats into a cave, causing global darkness. Her re-emergence is linked to ceremony, light, and sound. The Kojiki describes this myth in Book 1, where the use of mirrors and dancing rituals coax her radiant presence back into the world. This myth models withdrawal and reactivation of luminous force through resonance – reminiscent of plasma ignition and field manipulation, and parallels resonance techniques used in plasma excitation.

## **Zoroastrianism – Ahura Mazda and Fire Worship**

Ahura Mazda, the god of light in the Avesta (Yasna 62), is honoured through fire, seen as both a spiritual and physical manifestation of divine wisdom. Fire temples maintain eternal flames, representing divine speech and consciousness. Amesha Spentas, radiant divine agents and glowing spiritual intelligences, mirror the description of autonomous plasma

entities interacting with cosmic order. They represent divine attributes manifesting in radiant, structured form, mirroring coherent field-based plasma life theories.

### **Judaism and Jewish Mysticism – Zohar and the Sefirot, Ezekiel's vision**

The Zohar's commentary on Genesis introduces the Sefirot as radiant energy vessels forming the Tree of Life—dynamic, interacting spheres of divine light. These spheres behave in a network, transmitting force and intent—closely resembling field-bound plasma configurations.

Ezekiel 1:4–21 describes an immense luminous storm, flashing fire, glowing metal, and wheels within wheels, accompanied by sound and movement directed by a spirit. The complexity of form and behaviour is consistent with intelligently controlled plasma. The Zohar elaborates on the Sefirot—ten interconnected emanations or vessels of divine light.
